What is the Ministry of Money?

For nearly 30 years, Ministry of Money has provided opportunities for women and men to explore their relationship to money from a faith perspective.

Money is a paradox in our culture - it enslaves, yet it also frees; it is intensely private, but it is also very public; it measures worth, yet it is no measure of real worth; it destroys yet also creates. Ministry of Money offers weekend retreats, pilgrimages to developing countries, a quarterly newsletter and special-topic one-day workshops in an attempt to help individuals explore, understand and address issues of money and faith in their own lives, as well as in their families, political systems, institutions, and world.

Ministry of Money creates opportunities for relationship and dialogue and serves as a consistent resource as people continue on their own personal and collective faith and money journeys.

Leaders and participants avoid the use of words such as "should, ought, and must" and do not promote any particular formula or style. The heart of our ministry is providing safe, God centered forums for people to wrestle with their own questions and explore possibilities for authentically living out their beliefs.

Why a Retreat for Parents/Adults working with Kids?

In this age of conspicuous consumption, media messages of gaining happiness through buying things, the frenzied pace of children's activities, and a saturation of material goods, how are our

children learning to be faithful, generous children of God? How do we help them avoid an "entitlement" mentality and move them toward a grateful sense of what they have been given by God?

Money is the second most frequently mentioned subject in both the Hebrew and Christian scriptures - second only to idolatry in the Old Testament and to the Kingdom of God in the New Testament. As people of faith, we are called to look at the role of money in our lives. As adults influencing children, it is important for us to look at how our relationship with money is being absorbed and repeated by our children.

It is important to help them "rise above apathy and self-indulgence to a higher plane of security and self-worth that has nothing to do with money."
